During childhood Lisa's bird watching ignited her lifelong love of nature and the camera. In 2010, she turned her passion for photography into a business—and in 2015 she successfully transitioned to photography full-time and left the corporate and consulting world behind.

On July 12, Ms. Langell will deliver a presentation for SPC entitled "An artistic photographer lies in ALL of us." She will be presenting via Zoom and the presentation will be shown on the screen in The O'Neal Theatre. It can also be seen by members remotely using the Zoom application.

### Report of the New Normal Task Force

### I. INTRODUCTION

The Board of the SPC established the New Normal Task Force ("NNTF") at its January 18, 2021, monthly meeting. This group was tasked with examining issues created by the Covid-19 pandemic with respect to club activities and making recommendations to the Board.

Jacques Wood was appointed Chair of the NNTF with Judy Nappi, Jerry Kozel, JoAnn Sluder, Dennis Snipes, John German and Frank Lipski as members. President Scheve was an ex officio member of the NNTF. Subsequently three sub-groups were formed: Workshops & Outings (led by Jacques), Tech (led by Dennis) and In-person General Meetings (led by JoAnn). The NNTF had four full meetings; the sub-groups met on at least 14 occasions.

### II. LEGAL CONTEXT

- A. The SPC's Farm Bureau Insurance Policy does not provide any coverage for Covid-19 related claims as the policy has a Communicable Disease Exclusion.
- B. There is minimal potential for legal exposure to SPC for Covid-19 incidents if:
  - 1. SPC follows current CDC and North Carolina Covid-19 protocols applicable to club activities; and,
  - 2. This disclaimer of responsibility is periodically disseminated to members:

The Club will follow current federal and state guidelines and has developed protocols for so doing. The Club cannot however guarantee your health or safety in attendance at Club functions. It is up to each individual member to decide if he or she is comfortable in attending any in person outing, workshop or meeting.

On March 15, 2021, the Board approved and implemented the above two policies.

- C. The CDC on May 13, 2021 issued guidelines for fully vaccinated people.
- D. On May 14, 2021, NC Executive Order No. 215 was promulgated providing that:
  - Face covering requirements for all persons have been lifted in most settings.
  - Social distancing requirements have been lifted in all settings.
  - People may continue to wear face coverings which are recommended for unvaccinated people.
  - Businesses can still require guests to wear face coverings.
  - "Schools" are still required to follow NCDHHS Guidance with respect to indoor-face covering requirements and all other Covid-19 related restriction.

### III. OUTINGS AND WORKSHOPS

A. Outings: a protocol for Outings was developed and presented to the Board at the March 15, 2021, monthly meeting. The Board approved the protocol.

### B. Workshops:

- 1. The task force recommended that workshops be presented either via Zoom or fully in-person.
- 2. On June 22, 2021, the Sandhills Community College advised that the Garden Center will again be available for use by outside groups.
- 3. A specific protocol remains to be developed for in-person workshops; until such action is taken, the General Meeting Protocol discussed below will be used for workshops.

### IV. TECHNICAL SUPPORT FOR GENERAL MEETINGS

- A. Potential requirements: it is anticipated that competitions and programs will continue to have:
  - 1. Remote Judges/Presenters;
  - 2. Remote members attending via Zoom; and,
  - 3. Members attending in-person at the O'Neal facility.
- B. The Tech group extensively researched such "hybrid" meetings and such presentations are conceptually possible based upon:
  - 1. The use of at least three laptops, one club owned and two others loaned by members.
  - 2. The investments of approximately \$200 for cables and converters.
  - 3. Three members present to perform technical support for hybrid presentations. This support requirement necessitates adding one more member to the tech team who does not have other Board responsibilities.

The Tech group will facilitate a multi-location meeting for the July 12 General Meeting, but there still is a need for an additional club member to step up and serve on this group.

### V. IN-PERSON GENERAL MEETINGS

A. As of June 7, 2021 The O'Neal School started again allowing outside groups like SPC to use and/or rent its facilities. SPC was offered a renewal contract for use of the School's theater and theater lobby. This contract had one major change in Paragraph 5. Condition and Use of Property; the School has added a sub-paragraph d. which read as follows:

"Licensee hereby agrees to abide by all protocols and requirements in effect at the time of the facility usage relating to the COVID- 19 pandemic, including but not limited to wearing of masks, social distancing requirements, and cleaning and sanitization requirements."

A representative of the O'Neal School communicated that since Club meetings take place in an area where there are no students and are not for school "educational purposes" the NC school masking and other Covid-19 related restrictions are not applicable. On May 17, 2021, the Board approved the renewal contact with The O'Neal School.

A Protocol for SPC In-Person General Meetings was then developed. That Protocol which is set forth below was approved by the Board at its June 21 meeting.

The Membership Committee also presented to the Board a new registration/name-tags procedure which also was approved. The Membership Committee will continue to develop and implement appropriate procedures for membership meetings.

I thank all members of the New Normal Task Force for their hard work to develop options and protocols for the continuation of Club activities. I also thank Neva Scheve, Club President, for her support and guidance of the NNTF's mission.

### **General Meeting Protocol**

The Club will follow current federal and state guidelines and has developed protocols for so doing. The Club cannot however guarantee the health or safety of members who attend Club functions. It is up to each individual member to decide if he or she is comfortable in attending any in person outing, workshop or meeting.

**Attendance**: The Club will not require health verifications or conduct temperature screenings. A member should not however attend a club meeting if he or she is experiencing such symptoms as persistent coughing, sore throat, fever or a loss of smell or taste.

**Face Coverings**: As outlined in the current N. C. Executive Order No. 215, masks will not be required at Club meetings. On the Theatre door there is a mask requirement sign, but the School has advised that masking is not required for Club meetings.


The Center for Disease Control ("CDC") still however recommends that unvaccinated people wear face coverings. Each member under current guidelines may elect to wear or not to wear a face covering at a Club meeting. Masks will be available at the check-in desk.

**Social Distancing:** N. C. Executive Order No. 215 does not prescribe social distancing requirements in the Theatre facility. It is suggested that members exercise cautions in their personal interactions and respect other members' comfort zones. In the theatre proper, a social distance seating zone will be marked off (**See diagram on next page**). This zone will provide for at least 6 feet apart seating. Members, vaccinated or unvaccinated, may elect at their choice to sit in this marked zone.

**Check-in Procedure:** The Club has acquired a "EZBadge" computerized registration/name badge system.

**Food and Beverage:** At present food will not be provided at Club meetings. Bottled water will be available but cannot be taken into the auditorium space.

**Remote Presentations and Viewing:** It is anticipated that some Presenters and Judges will continue to participate in meetings via the Zoom software application. The Club will strive to make viewing of meetings available to all members via Zoom subject to resource requirements

But if you miss the e-mail, come anyway. The process should be fluid and easy.



1988, my husband and I subscribed to The Pilot and I

found Bill Stoffel's Creative Photography Class at Sandhills and The Sandhills
Photography Club listed in the calendar section. Both appealed to me because I already had
an SLR camera, and I had been a member of the Capital City Camera Club in Raleigh. So, as
soon as we moved, I joined both, just in time to go on my first Photo Field trip to Cades
Cove. Husband Fran and I met the other members and had a wonderful time and went on
every field trip after that.

Little did I know what a difference the Photo Club would make in my life! I had always been very bashful, but here I was taking part in exhibitions and competitions, making my own prints in a darkroom in my garage, cutting mats, framing photos, going on all the field trips, participating in photo workshops and creating the monthly newsletter. Then, I was elected President and I realized that I WAS NO LONGER BASHFUL!

After Bill Stoffel, founder of the Photo Club, passed away, his wife, Kaye, came to me with all of Bill's class notes and asked me to carry on the work Bill had started, which I gratefully accepted. So, another chapter of my life, 'TEACHING', began. Encouraged by my friends Gisela Danielson, Jill Margeson and June White, I taught the first of many classes entitled, "Creative Photography, The Bill Stoffel Method" and "Using Your Digital Camera". The classes caught on like a wildfire and for several years, I taught many of the photo club members, 4-H clubs, art groups, NC State extension staff and club members, O'Neal students and even the Pinehurst employees! What a fun time that was!

Over the years, I was lucky enough to serve in most all officer positions, plus chairperson of Workshops, Field Trips, was on the first Competition Rules Committee, judged competitions, presented programs and whatever else I was asked to do. Members can ask Dave Powers about his reaction when I announced some out of the way Field Trip destinations! The club has traveled many miles, including a bus trip all the way to Callaway Gardens, Georgia!

When I joined the Photo Club, cameras were totally manual. We had to set EVERYTHING manually! We usually shot slide film because most competitions used slides. Color printers, color monitors and Photoshop didn't exist. Home computers were very basic with very small amounts of system memory and no hard drives, only just big floppy disks about the size of a 45 music record! (If anybody remembers those!). Yet, we all succeeded in producing excellent slides and prints! Looking back, that is really amazing!

When digital photography arrived, Bill Matthews and I were the first club members to try out the new, but still very basic, technology. We each had a digital point and shoot Olympus camera that took fairly low-resolution photos. But we proudly showed the club what could be done and had a great time playing around with our new cameras. Something that is very important to mention is the way members have always been willing to freely share their photography knowledge with others.

During the last 8 years I haven't been very active in the club because I cared for my husband at home during a long spell of bad health and death, and later, because of my inability to see well enough to drive at night! However, the club is still very important to me and I will faithfully continue my support as a member and will help out in any way I can.

Thank you for giving recognition to all of us old timers. It means the world to me and I'm sure it means the same to the others who were recognized!



# My Journey with SPC Jim Smith

Oh my, where to start? After leaving IBM in 1991, I started my own consulting business, which was quite successful. 
