#### **COMPETITION COMMITTEE**

At the April 11th meeting, we will hold a PRINT competition for "Portraits" presented by Class B and A entrants. Details of the competition were described in the February 2011 Newsletter (see club website www.sandhillsphotoclub.org for this edition). Entries must be pre-registered with Competition Committee member Gene Lentz at competitions@sandhillsphotoclub.org by 11:59PM on Sunday, April 3, 2011. When pre-registering, also submit digital images of prints being entered to Gene so that after the competition they can be posted on the club website and the winners sent to the local media. Please refer to the Competition Manual on the club website for details on how to prepare and identify prints and how to identify and submit the accompanying digital images. On the night of the competition, prints being entered will be checked in by Competition Committee members in the "refreshment" room of the church before the meeting.

The judge for the April 11th competition is **Tim Sayer** of **Sayer Photography** in Southern Pines. Tim graduated from the College of Charleston. While working in the food and beverage industry, he became interested in photography after a trip to Costa Rica in 2000. He saved his money, took a year off to intensely study photography, and in 2004 established Sayer Photography. His objective was to have a studio committed to providing an exciting option for high-end portraiture and innovative wedding photography that reached beyond the scope of what traditional studio photography normally offers. For the past 6 years, Tim has followed his muse while documenting the lives and businesses of clients throughout the East Coast. He also has been a photographer for PineStraw for several years shooting many of the covers for the magazine. Tim has won several significant awards. In 2010, he was named Wedding Photography Society Photographer of the Year. Throughout his career, he has used his skill and fertile imagination to create images that provide clients with an artful glimpse into themselves and their loved ones.

"Birds" will be the subject of the June 13, 2011 competition. This will be a DIGITAL competition but without the usual Class B and A categories. Instead, Class B and A will be combined and awards given in 2 groups: "Wild Birds" and "Confined Birds". These groups are defined as: "Wild Birds" are in their natural habitat, and "Confined Birds" are live birds in zoos, rescue facilities, or caged, tied or enclosed. Up to 2 entries can be submitted that have been taken within the past 5 years (on or after June 13, 2006). An entry can be made in each group or both in the same group. Entries must follow the DIGITAL competition guidelines listed in the Competition Manual on the club's website (Note that these guidelines will probably be updated by early May to tailor them for the club's new projector). Entries for this competition must be received by Competition Committee member Gene Lentz at competitions@sandhillsphotoclub.org by 11:59PM on Sunday, June 5, 2011.

#### Archiving Your Digital Images with Art Reetz

This workshop will cover the best media (CD, DVD, Blu-ray, hard drive, SS, off-site etc.) and suitable data formats (compressed vs. uncompressed) for safely storing your digital images. The presentation will include a discussion of how to minimize your chances of losing your files.

#### Light, Lights, Lighting, Flash, Strobe with Dave Verchick & Tom Reedy

Saturday, May 14, 9:00 to 12:00 am.

This workshop will be an introduction to one of the most important things we photographers have to use to make a picture - light! Dave will demystify some of Nikon's iTTL flash lighting secrets and show you how he solves difficult lighting situations with his Nikon equipment while Tom Reedy will be on hand to translate for Cannon shooters with ETTL. Flash Basics/Flash Exposure Modes/Flash Sync/Fill Flash/Positioning/Multiple Flash/Wireless and the Better Beamer will be covered.

The workshop will start in the Burlingame Room and, weather permitting, will conclude with a move outside for actual shooting including advice on aiming the Better Beamer. Led by *Dave-The-Heckler Verchick*, it should be fun and learning for all!

This years Spring Trip will be to Winston-Salem. The dates are Sunday, May 1<sup>st</sup> thru Tuesday, May 3<sup>rd</sup>



We plan to stay at the Brookstown Inn which is a refurbished textile mill built in 1837 and is on the National Register of Historic Places. The room rates are \$90.00 per night and the meeting room charge is \$125.00. Continental breakfast is included in the room rate as well as a wine/cheese time each evening and milk/cookies at bedtime. It is an older inn but does have modern amenities such as cable TV and free Wi-Fi. It is a short walk from Old Salem and about 10 minutes from Reynolda Gardens. There is also a restaurant onsite that is open for dinner-it is closed on Sundays.

Monday, we plan to tour Reynolda Gardens and Tuesday, visit Old Salem, but there are other places of interest close by. Korner's Folly is located in Kernersville and might be a good Sunday stop on the way to Winston-Salem. A few other points of interest in the city would be: The Downtown Arts District, Historic Bethabara Park, The Single Sisters House Museum, Reynolda House Museum and the Museum of Anthropology.

We are currently in contact with Chris Almerini from Carolinas Nature Photography Association, who may put on a presentation about Winston-Salem attractions for us Sunday evening.

#### Update on Moore For Our Future:

Hello all, I wanted to start out by saying a big thank you for the support your organization has shown the county during the effort to update our county land use plan. A special thanks goes out to *John German* who has been coordinating the files between your Club members and our planning department. Members of the photography club have sent just over 2,600 pictures in the past year to use in all things Moore County Planning! The projects where we have used your Club's pictures have included a Visual Preference Survey for the Regional Sustainability Symposium co-hosted by the Moore County Chamber of Commerce and Sustainable Sandhills in November 2010, the ongoing work with the county's Working Lands Protection Plan, and initial work associated with the Land Use Plan update. We have been actively giving credit to the club as a whole and we get several compliments on everyone's work!

To date we have been very busy gathering and analyzing all different types information useful to a land use plan update. Currently we are working with the Moore County Planning Board to kick-off a citizen based advisory committee to guide the plan update. I hope to have more information to share with your Club in the coming months on how that committee will be formed and offer you all a chance to participate in some way.

Please keep up the great work, we appreciate the pictures greatly and look forward to working with your Club more in the next phases of our planning efforts! ## TO ALL WILDLIFE PHOTOGRAPHERS

So where are we going next? Everyone seems eager for another field trip. We have new lenses and camera bodies that need to be exercised. Juan Pons has educated us on what it takes to capture good wildlife images.

I would like to suggest the Waccatee Zoo near Myrtle Beach. It is not much of a zoo, but it does have a small egret rookery (10 to 15 nests?). Several of us visited it last year and we got some good images of birds in nests and in flight.

The best light at the zoo is from 7:30 to 10 AM. The zoo does not open until 10 AM. We made a special arrangement with the zoo to enter when the staff gets there about 7:30 AM or 8:00 AM. We left Pinehurst around 5:15 AM. Yes, that is pretty early, but the lighting requires getting there early. We shot until around 11 AM. We left, stopped for lunch, and were home mid-afternoon. The weather was lovely and it was a pleasant day.

From mid-April through mid-May the rookery is at peak activity. I would suggest that we shoot for Thursday, April 28, and/or Thursday, May 5. The rookery is small and the shooting location can only accommodate about 6 photographers with tripods. If we have more than 6, we will have to shoot on multiple days. I think the zoo would be happy to have us.

A 400 mm or longer lens (with tripod) is

required for good, sharp shots of the nesting birds with young. Birds in flight are constantly going overhead and can be captured with an 80-200 zoom (or longer).

I have included four images from last year's trip. Three were shot with my 500 mm lens. The bird directly overhead was shot with my 100-400 zoom.

Please let me know if you might be interested. I will send an email out as soon as I know if we have sufficient interest to start planning this trip. Zoo admission is \$8 as I recall.


