Despite this time of disruption, our competition "Dominant Yellow" will take place on the regularly scheduled meeting date of April 13. We had 84 entries, another whopping success! We will be meeting using Zoom and you will be receiving an email about this tele-conferencing app. Do not be afraid!! Zoom is



easy to use and will enable you to view the competition from the comfort of your home. Check your email frequently as we will be offering four different times of instruction for using Zoom. It really is fun and will enable us to continue "almost normally" in these trying times. Once again, we had many beautiful images submitted for the competition and you won't want to miss it! Before the galleries closed, we knew we would not have an in-person meeting in April. Because the competition would be online, we decided not to limit the number of entries. It may be long, but you'll be free to get up and go to the fridge, watch in your pajamas, refill your wine glass, or just leave the meeting and go to bed! We will ask the judge to limit her comments, but it may be a long meeting. Hey, you have nowhere to go, so sit back and enjoy!

If you have spare time on your hands while being quarantined, upcoming competition topics include "What's in the Kitchen?" and "Less is More." See details below.

"What's in the Kitchen?" will be the August competition topic. Take a photo of anything: patterns from the floor, dishes, cupboard; still life involving kitchens things; scene through the window into a kitchen; fancy food on a plate; design/shadows with silverware; person in the kitchen; restaurant kitchen; reflections from pans, knives. Play with light and composition.

"Less is More" will be December's topic. The focus is on one small key element and the rest of the composition is completely clutter free.

The topic for June is 25 Mile Radius and Spontaneous Public Scenes is the topic for October. In these times of quarantine and social spacing, these may be more challenging (at least in the short term).

One final note for your consideration: Our January judge Rob Byron suffered a stroke on March 13. As you may recall, Rob's wife is severely disabled, and he is now unable to take care of her. Their son has started a GoFund Me page and you may want to consider donating. Although we did not know Rob prior to the competition, several members have donated in an effort to help a fellow photographer. Hope everyone is staying safe!

I Have OCD - Obsessive Cropping Disorder

Crop, Crop, Crop

Every photo out of your camera can be improved by using image editing software. No matter if you use free tools like Microsoft Photo Viewer, Apple Photos, Google SnapSeed or paid software like LightRoom and PhotoShop - every photo can be made better.

Enhance your images by applying a filter, adjust the light, straighten the horizon, boost the color, increase the clarity or how about a vignette? Add a border, insert some text, use some spot healing, change it to black and white, and crop, crop, crop.

I am far from a photography purest. Yes, I am always trying to 'get in right in-camera', but once the image is made, I'm all about making it better.


When it comes to cropping, you can make a big difference. Take a look at this original image from the 2019 U.S. Amateur in Pinehurst. It is of local caddie Keith Silva and William Holcomb, a young and likable Senior at Sam Huston State University. Not very remarkable, right?

There is an important bond between a player and a caddie. If I can get a shot of them talking, pointing, looking at the scorecard, tossing up grass or any kind of gesture, I'm happy.

> Take another look at the original image on the left. Not a remarkably shot by any standard. But I knew that I could crop it later. The most important part was making sure it was in focus and catching them talking.

The Crop tool in LightRoom allowed me to get creative. Here is the same image cropped to a square, the format that works best for Instagram.

This 4 x 3 horizontal version was used on the Pinehurst

Now an even tighter crop. See how it brings out their facial expressions?

Finally, a 4 x 3 vertical version that worked for Facebook and Twitter. Notice how I created some negative space for them to look in to.

Some advise about cropping.

- Get your horizon line level,
- Never crop at the joints. Cutting people at the ankles, knees, writs and elbows make the photo look creepy,
- It is sometimes OK to crop off the top of heads, but try not to,
- Leave some space between the edge of the frame and your subject
- Crop so that your subject is looking or moving into negative space,
- Get your horizon line level,
- If there is nothing to judge the horizon line, use a vertical element,
- Keep in mind the basic rules of composition,
- Finally, get your horizon line level.
