At our meeting on Monday October 12th, we will hold a competition on the topic of *"Farm Animals"*. These are animals found on farms that are owned (some animals are present on farms but are not owned e.g. Snakes). This is a digital competition with a three year time limit. The judge for this competition is Andie Rose, the Assistant Editor and Art Director of PineStraw Magazine. Andie grew up in Southern Pines, graduated from Pinecrest High School, and subsequently graduated from East Carolina University with a BFA in Communication Arts. After college she moved to Dallas, Texas. There she worked for Texas Homes Magazine, Horchow Catalog and at American Airlines on their in-flight magazine—American

Way. She moved to South Carolina and worked for advertising agencies and as a design director for Calvin Gilmore's shows: The Carolina Opry and the Dixie Jubilee. Andie returned to Southern Pines in 1997 as a free-lance designer. She founded PineStraw Magazine in 2005. In 2008 she joined The Pilot newspaper where she continued to improve the magazine to what it is today. Andie is also the Art Director for two sister publications...O.Henry Magazine in Greensboro and Salt in Wilmington. Her duties include story ideas, assigning photography, and laying out the magazines.

On December 14th, we will hold a competition on the topic of *"Christmas"*. This is also a digital competition with a three year time limit. This will be an on-line competition and SPC members will serve as judges. Smugmug will open for entries on Sunday November 15th and close on Sunday November 29th at 6 PM. Photo Club members will judge the entries from December 1st thru December 6th.

"Ten Things I've learned in Fifty Years", submitted by Jill Margeson

Cole Thompson (<u>http://www.colethompsonphotography.com/</u>), a featured speaker at 2014 PSA conference, has written an 8 page article expounding on what he has learned. Here are very brief excerpts of the 10 topics he addresses:

- 1. Don't aspire to become the world's greatest imitator; Find out what you can create to show your vision-not someone else's.
- 2. Vision is what gives your images a soul and makes them unique.
- 3. Don't compare your work to others. Art is not a competition. You work to better yourself.
- 4. Simple is better than complicated.
- 5. If you're not passionate about your project, choose a new one.
- 6. Don't follow any photographic rules. If you do, you will be making very average images.
- 7. Don't listen to other people's advice. Only by pleasing yourself can you create your best work.
- 8. Use Photoshop however works best for you.
- 9. Skills and equipment are not really as important as your Vision. That's what makes an image great and what drives your equipment and processes.
- 10. Define success for yourself. Be proud of what you do and love what you create.

Consider joining PSA-Photographic Society of America (<u>www.psa-photo.org</u>) and getting involved with PSA activities and relationships. 
